Smoking

Elections

Social Media

-Lakeside has a Facebook page, as well as a gsg slack channel. We want to communicate this to residents so they can join those pages. We want to use those resources more this year,

Social Events

-We are considering planning some virtual holiday events, especially because some people cannot travel easily this winter.

We would like Lakeside community members with children to feel included so we would like to make some of these events child-friendly.

-Julia is interested in sending out an email assessing interest in starting a book club. Kevin says he is also happy to help coordinate about programming.

-Lindsay did a slack poll about virtual events: learning to take care of / potting indoor plants was popular, baking holiday cookies was popular. She will follow up with Jessica, Julia, Kevin and Gloria about those events.

-Budget for social events is handled by Emily the treasurer, we will coordinate with her. Our budget should be pretty strong because we haven't held many social events since the beginning of the pandemic.

-Julia says the library has a service which has free downloadable bestselling Kindle books for an Overdrive account that is linked to your Princeton email address. We will try to advertise this. (https://princeton.overdrive.com/)

Garden

-Potential changes to garden membership. We want to expand options for garden membership over the next year. We want to add an herb membership with access to the communal herbs. This would be a low commitment way to participate in the garden. People who do not live here during the full agricultural year (May-October) are not eligible for a plot. The herb membership would be a pilot program, with ~15 people. The herb-members would rotate through the season, maintaining the communal herbs every few weeks, so it wouldn't matter if some of those people have to do field work or are otherwise traveling for months at a time. Jessica is leading this initiative.

Open Forum

-Mark: We've noticed the study rooms in Lakeside get reserved by the same people, its first come first serve, the same people come in and they then stay all day. We were going to implement a 4 hour time limit and then announce it in the next newsletter.
